This will include a full day of activities such as workshops, watching the show, cast Q&A's and more! These will be on 26 September and 7 November, between 9:30 - 17:30 with a 13:30 show time.

What Will The Days Include?

We will be welcoming various schools and colleges from around the country, as we host a full day of activities within the theatre. In the morning we will be bring everyone together in the main theatre space to do a workshop with some of the cast and creatives. Next your students will learn about all the wonderful careers in the arts available to them, from costume, make up, lighting, sound and more through workshops and demonstrations. In the Great Hall there will also be a live resource pack of the shows, with costumes on display, production shots, information and more. Then we will all come back together to watch the show, followed by an exclusive Q&A with the cast and creatives.

This is the first time we are offering a day like this and we are really looking forward to welcoming you to special day of events. Each day will be between 9:30 - 17:30 with a 13:30 show time.

Rumours that the British Empire plans to partition Bengal spread and uncertainty is never far away. For one Indian boy destiny is found on the banks of the River Padma before the Goddess Lakshmi. Here a promise is made. Born out of terror or kindness the choice Pipli makes that night will shape his life forever. Pooja Ghai directs Tanika Gupta's adaption of Charles Dickens' Great Expectations. Pipli moves from his home in Rajshahi to the bustling streets of Calcutta. With an open heart he navigates unforgiving darkness and unsettling friendships in his search for a better future. For Pipli, dharma – the right way of living, is never far away.
