#### **About the production**

Debs is convinced she saw a man turn into a pigeon outside The Bridge Inn in 1987. 20 years later she is still telling the tale to anyone who will listen. The pub now stands abandoned, set to be demolished to make way for a new housing estate, and Debs is on a mission to save it! But something strange is slowly happening. What starts as a twinge in her back, becomes something more bizarre than she could possibly imagine.

Pigeon was commissioned by the Royal Exchange Theatre, following conversations with our Ambassadors about what they wanted for the Local Exchange Festival programme. Fed up with the same stories about the area that focused on 'coal, cotton and canals', they asked for a play about folklore, local stories and community. Then once writer, Joseph Walsh, met with the Ambassadors and gathered their stories, Pigeon was born.
